Scene 1 The Migration:

Scene 2 Dream Hula:

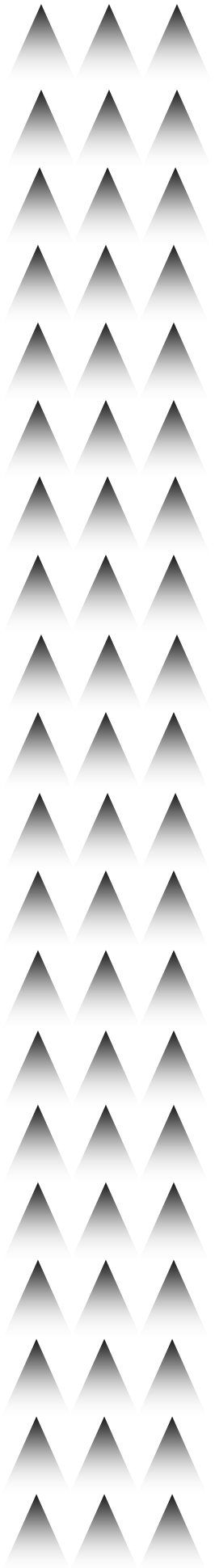
A smooth and very sultry dance solo done as if in a dream. The soloist is dressed in shells that reflect light from all angles as she glides across the stage mythically.

This scene pays homage to the strength and agility of Kahekili; Maui's most feared ruling chief. The men will carry weapons through the crowd as if hunting and make their way to the stage for an all men hula depicting battle cries and chants.

Scene 4 Pele's Voyage:

This is a crowd favorite that tells the storey of Madame Pele traveling across the Pacific in search of a new home to continue her craft of lava. This is portrayed with vibrantly colored costumes and beautiful hula.

Scene 5 The Mo'o:

The Mo'o forest is deep in the Hawaiian forest where a mysterious creature dwells. The Mo'o or mythical lizard is known to have magical strength and powers. He is also famous for being haughty and protective of his domain. Hi'iaka, younger sister of Pele is sent on a quest for Pele and comes upon the lair of the great Mo'o and he calls to challenge her in a tricky game of chance and riddle in order for her to pass.

HULA and STILT WALKERS

Scene 6 Swing Hula:

This section tells of the sailors down at the docks, interacting with the hula girls. This section will be fast moving and involve play acting comedy. It will also utilize the hula implements of that time of when jump and swing were introduced to Hawaii.

Scene 7 Naulu:

We continue to utilize the parachute as a performing arts piece because the fabric comes alive in such a way that cannot be duplicated by human hands. It plays on the air in its own movement while floating around the dancer

Scene 8 Fire Knife:

The dancer's are synchronized with their fire knives as they swing and move and punch through the air.
